
IRCON completes project in Sri Lanka

India links Colombo to Killinocchi via railway line

New Delhi, Sept 15: The railway route linking the political home of Sri Lanka's Tamil Tiger rebels with the rest of the island rolled into service on Saturday after a 23-year interruption. The day marked a proud moment not only for Sri Lanka but also for Indian Railways whose PSU Ircon International had undertaken the rebuilding project.

The project is a part of efforts to promote reconciliation with the Tamil minority and heal the scars of the long-running separatist conflict. The train, carrying President Mahinda Rajapakse, arrived in the town of Kilinochchi, 330 kms north of Colombo, four years after the end of a nearly four-decade civil war.

Ircon Intl Ltd completes reconstruction of railway line in northern Sri Lanka

The Ircon International Limited, a Government company under the Railway Ministry, has completed the reconstruction of Omanthai — Kilinochchi railway line in Northern Sri Lanka. This 63-km long line was inaugurated by Sri Lankan president Mahinda Rajapaksa on Saturday. Ircon CMD Mohan Tiwari and General Manager SL Guptaalong with other senior officials of Government of Sri Lanka were also present.

"Train service recommenced on this section after a gap of 23 years," Iron spokesman claimed. The railway tracks from Omanthai to Kankasanthurai and Medawachiya to Talaimannar were completely destroyed during the devastating years of war in the region.

New Delhi had subsequently extended lines of credit to build the 252 km railway lines in Northern Province.

India-funded Lankan rail takes off

A Sri Lankan rail project funded and executed by India began operations on Saturday with resumption of train services to the LTTE's erstwhile stronghold in the island's Tamil-dominated north region.

President Mahinda Rajapaksa launched the 'Yal Devi' (The Queen of Jaffna) train that departed from Omanthai with Rajapaksa on board and arrived in the former LTTE headquarters of Kilinochchi, 30 minutes later.

The service resumed after over two decades, during which the LTTE attacked the Colombo-Jaffna train twice in the course of the Sri Lankan civil war.

In January 1985, the train was blown up, killing 28 soldiers and injuring over a 100 passengers.

Another attack by the LTTE in 1990 saw the complete abandonment of services.

The restoration of the railway track destroyed by the protracted conflict began in 2009 after the military defeat of the LTTE.

Indian engineering firm Ircon International was awarded the \$185 million contract to restore the 62 km-long track route between Omanthai and Kilinochchi.

The first phase of restoration saw the track being repaired between Vavuniya and Omanthai.

Since the war ended in 2009, the Indian Government has extended its support to Sri Lanka to rebuild the entire 252 km-long route under a \$800 million credit line.

The train would next be extended up to Jaffna, completing the full restoration of the service, railway officials said.
